LOCATION

Camp Crowder is located in Newton County. The nearest urban area is Neosho, MO., with a population of 9,500, 2 miles distant. Commercial air service, bus terminal, taxi service and car rental service is available in Joplin, MO., 25 miles distant. Taxi service is available in Neosho, MO. Additional commercial air service is available in Springfield,

MO., 80 miles distant; Kansas City, MO., 160 miles distant; and Tulsa, OK, 100 miles distant.

DESCRIPTION

The site consists of 4,358 acres, of which approximately 4,208 acres are available for training including the cantonment area. The terrain consists of rolling timberland and prairie land.

During non-live fire periods, two battalion sized combat arms units or combat service support units can be accommodated at one time. During live fire periods, one battalion sized combat arms unit or combat service support unit can be accommodated in addition to units conducting range firing.

FACILITIES

Billiting. Two barracks are available to house 181 troops, 2 barracks can house 100 troops each with 25 bed spaces per quad are available in a separate area. Three 10 bed UEQ/UOQs, one 5 bed UEQ/UOQ are also available. One BOQ with 16 bed spaces with 7 two bed space pods and 2 one bed space pods are available in a separate area. One barracks with 124 bed spaces, drill floor and dining facility that feeds 75 persons/hour is available in a separate area.

Dining Facilities. Three separate mess facilities available – 1 supports 250 persons/hour, 1 supports 150 persons/hour, and the previously mentioned one that feeds 75 persons/hour. No separate cold storage refrigeration units are available.

Maintenance. One facility engineer shop with office (11,000 sq.ft.), one wash bay (two stalls) with steam cleaning capability, one battalion motor park with security lighting and security fencing, one maintenance shelter, one capitalized fuel site (5000 gallon capacity), and one remote fueling site.

Administrative Facilities. Three battalion sized areas and two company sized area available for briefings, general instruction, or other admin/supply requirements; one battalion administration/supply/classroom building includes two classrooms - maximum capacity 50 students ea.; two buildings to support laundry requirements (1 in the cantonment area and 1 in the field area); two field showers; one multipurpose building is available to use as a gymnasium, auditorium, or classroom (total 10,500 sq. ft.); and one weapons simulation building (5,300 sq. ft).

Army Aviation Facilities. Fixed wing utilizes Neosho Municipal Airport, 1 mile west of the training site. Multiple rotary wing landing sites available on post.

Medical Facilities. Troop Medical Clinic (TMC) (3,765 sq. ft), with dental equip, hearing booth, EKG, glaucoma, refraction eye machine, and vision testing machine and alert ID tag machine available upon coordination with MSG Neely.

Classroom Facilities. Two classrooms (100 students maximum capacity ea.) and one classroom (200 students maximum capacity with distance learning center available – building identified under Admin Facilities).

Physical Fitness. Two mile running course on hard surface, 1 physical fitness room with various equipment.

Public Hospital. Freeman Neosho Hospital (58 beds) located 5 miles distant.

TRAINING

Total Training Site Acreage. 4,358 acres.

Available Maneuver Acreage. 3,154 acres. Note: 2,610 acres are not available during range (live fire) operations.

General Training Land Use Restrictions. No live fire in Training Areas (TAs) north of State Highway "D". Live fire exercises close down approximately 2,610 acres (south of State Highway "D"). Range use requires 24-hour prior notification. Range operation closes two bivouac sites and three training sites. Smoke grenades may be used within Training Center SOP established guidelines and with the presence of qualified personnel.

Simulation Capability. One multipurpose building (10,500-sq. ft.) with classroom, instructor preparation area, and large open area supported with fiber optics and computer data lines. One weapons simulation building (5,300-sq. ft.) designed and set up to support BEAMHIT and EST 2000 systems.

Individual Training Sites. One Water Purification Points; one Float Bridge site; two Timber Trestle Bridge sites (wet and dry spans); one Heavy Engineer Equipment Training site; one Air Assault Obstacle Course; two Rappelling sites (1 site is a 25 ft. gentle slope and 1 site is a 40 ft. tower w/board and helicopter skid rappelling points); one Combat in City Facility (MOUT) non live fire site consisting of 7 Conexes; one Field Fortification site; four Land Navigation sites (2 Day Land Navigation courses, 1 Night Land Navigation course, and 1 Mounted Land Navigation course); one Rigging site; one Landmine Warfare site with sand pit; two Bailey Bridge sites (wet and dry spans) with ½ set of Bailey Bridge and ½ set of Erection Set on hand; one Medium Girder Bridge (MGB) span; one EPW site (w/4 internal compounds and 5 towers); one Entry Control Point and Platoon sized Tactical Training Base; one hand grenade non-firing accuracy course.

State Support. The State operates a Field Maintenance Shop (FMS) #13 at this site. The FMS has security lighting and a fenced security compound.

ENVIRONMENTAL

Threatened and Endangered Species. At this time there are no federally recognized rare, threatened or endangered species that would exclude training activities at this site. There are some species that might cause some minor restrictions placed on selected areas or cause movement of a particular training activity to another area within the training site.

Environmental Imposed Constraints on Training. There are no significant environmental imposed constraints on training within this training site. The area does contain a total of approximately 10 acres (wetlands, cultural and cleanup sites) that pose some degree of restriction on training.

From I-44 West, take Exit 11A, South 71 Hwy (Ft Smith/Neosho) to US 60 Exit (Seneca/Neosho -15.4 mi). Turn left onto US 60 to US 71 BR/MO 59. Turn South (right, proceed 1.2 mi). Turn left (east) onto MO Hwy "D" (Lyon Drive , proceed 1.4 mi). Turn right onto MO Hwy "D" /Doniphan Drive; proceed .3/10 mile to Ray A. Carver Ave. and turn left. Crowder College lies north of Camp Crowder.
